Dr. Dennis Cleary is an associate professor and the founding program director of Occupational Therapy at Indiana University in South Bend. He has over 20 years of experience as a practicing occupational therapist, including 13 years as a faculty member— ten of which were as the Academic Fieldwork Coordinator. He maintains a clinical practice serving children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. He works to test and refine methods to support young adults in academic, social, and work environments through the use of technology, activity analysis, education and job-matching strategies. He has received over \$5.3 million in funding from the U.S. Department of Education, the U.S. Department of Transportation, and state and local agencies as a principal investigator, co-principal investigator, and consultant. He has over forty presentations at national and international meetings and has 14 peer-reviewed publications.
